Recruitment

Last year we were inundated with applications and our current Year 9 has remained full throughout the year with a waiting list. Sadly, this year, numbers for Year 9 suggest that we only have enough for a two form entry at this point (60 student applications) and we are moving forward on this basis for September 2024, topping up in year 10 in September 2025. We will continue to hold applications that are made in excess of 60 with an aim of getting up to 90, but with staffing to allocate, contracts to arrange and transition night to hold, we now must move forward. If you know of friends with students wishing to apply for September, please encourage them to do so urgently, or they may miss the chance to be part of college for another 12 months.

Sixth form numbers are blooming and we will exceed the DFE target – it will be smashing to be hosting a sixth form in excess of 50 students next year.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR PHYSICAL AND MENTAL WELL-BEING

To recognise excellent behaviour and hard work Year 9 students will be invited on a Beach activity rewards trip on the morning of the 24th of May. The planned trip will allow students to enjoy craft and sports activities on South Bay.

Invitation letters for the trip will be issued on Tuesday 16th May. These should be returned by Friday 17th May 2024. This beach trip is a regular activity, and we often use both South Bay or Cayton Bay for trip activities during the Summer term.

NATIONAL CRIME AGENCY SAFEGUARDING NOTIFICATION

Sextortion is a significant risk to students aged 14-18.

This type of crime involves an adult offender (often from an organised crime group based overseas) threatening to release nude or semi-nude images and/or videos of a child or young person, unless they pay money, or meet another financial demand, such as purchasing a prepaid gift card.

Victims of any age and gender can be targets, however a substantial proportion of cases have involved male victims aged 14-18.

A child or young person is never to blame if they have been a victim. Offenders will have tricked, groomed and/or manipulated them into sharing an image. Find out more about online blackmail on CEOP Education's parents and carers website.

ACHIEVING PROFESSIONAL REWARDS AND ATTENDANCE REWARDS

Student's positives are identified and can be viewed on BROMCOM MCAS. The points identify the elements of our college ethos and that of being a "Young Professional". We encourage students to review progress regularly. Each week reward vouchers are issued in assembly to recognise achievement and hard work.

Additional Professional points have been applied to recognise exceptionally good attendance or improving attendance, so look out for this on My Child at School.

ATTENDANCE

All medical and illness absences should be reported daily by parents using our absence line or enquiries to Miss. Brown our Attendance and Data Manager. Should you make a call for a reported student illness— please expect a phone call back from the attendance team to check details and provide support as required.

Attendance will always be a continual reminder. Excellent attendance is above 96.5%. All students with 100% receive 10 professional points per week. Students above the 96.5 target receive an extra 5 points per week.

Attendance monitoring and formal procedures are followed robustly. We work closely with NYCC attendance team to address attendance concerns at the earliest stage.

SAFEGUARDING

It is essential for safeguarding purposes that Lanyards and identity cards are worn at all times. Should cards become lost or damaged these must be replaced. Replacements can be purchased via parent pay. Students without ID cards and Lanyards will have replacements charged to parent pay.

Lanyards are required for identification for all students and working staff within the building. Students who forget such items are required to sign into college manually receive a Stage 1 and must hand in their devices -this adds to workload. It is our students' responsibility to ensure they are prepared for each day.
