Y10 & 12

Good routine revision practice is essential throughout this period in Year 10 and 12. Students complete a number of assessments across statutory subjects and Engineering or Health Pathways, it is important that students pay due attention to coursework deadlines and revise regularly

Please check MCAS for updated targets, assessment data, behaviour data and attendance data. Regular revision should be in place to prepare for ongoing exams. Assessments include formal exams, class assessments, GL tests and CAT Tests. This assessment will be used to determine class setting in September for core subjects. Assessment information is scheduled for release in the week commencing Monday 18th July 2022.

TECHNICAL EXCELLENCE

News from Systems control this week; It's all about Year 10 in Systems - Year 10 Systems Control students have been finalising their printed circuit board (PCB) designs ready for manufacturing. After the design of PCB's, it is always enjoyable to see students at the manufacturing stage, especially with their own designs. Students must create a photo-diary of their stages, to include in their e-portfolio as it documents their safe working, independence, and technical excellence using tools and equipment and processes. We have already carried out a pre-assessment task using a multimeter on a prototyped breadboard circuit as a reminder about the different uses of a meter. The start of year 11 will involve making a test plan, and then carrying out a series of electrical tests on their circuit, before moving on to the next coursework unit.

Thank you to parents who are encouraging their children to come to the support sessions that we volunteer to run on a Monday and Wednesday. It is making a big difference to student confidence, students are proud of their work, and we could not do this without your

continued support. This is offered so that any student who wants to make their coursework the best it can be, or has missed some time due to COVID, or other illness can do something about it.

With the end of term reporting, please be aware that when sharing information for attitude to learning (AtL) as well as attainment, the AtL mark is a measure of attendance and engagement with learning that after absence, have students been positive about doing what is needed, making efforts to check online, respond to feedback, attend support, communicate about what they need support with as part of our online learning platform. As a UTC we offer so many reasons why it is positive to be in every engineering lesson persistently present. What would your child want to be feeling about themselves a year from now, at the end of their Year 11 having completed all of their exams and coursework? It is perhaps worth asking before the end of term. Maybe write a few words down. This can sometimes be a conversation that gives food for thought, and contribute towards a more mature attitude. Hopefully they would want to feel that they had tried their best, and that they would be looking forward to their results, knowing that they had done their best.
