ATTENDANCE & SAFETY

Personal Health and Safety is a continual focus to support the learning and the destinations of our students.

Being prepared for working life is essential. With this in mind excellent attendance is an important expectation and to support this timely attendance calls are essential to update registers and follow up with support.

We look at patterns of non-attendance and recognise excellent attendance. All students should aim for above 96%, any attendance below 94% can be improved and any below 90% is considered persistent absentee. Attendance information is available on your "My Child at School" App.

The better the attendance the better the outcome, for example improving attendance from 94% to 96% is likely to improve outcomes in each subject by one whole grade.

Nationally: In KS4 83.7% of students who had excellent attendance achieved grades 9-4 in English and Maths compared to only 35.6% of pupils who had attendance below 90%.

Students who achieved English and Maths Grade 5.	Had an average attendance of: 96.3%
Students who achieved English and Maths Grade 4	Had an average attendance of: 94.8%
Students who did not achieve Maths and English Grade 4	Had an average attendance of: Below 91%
