INTRODUCTION

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the first Newsflash of 2023.

This report is a credit to you as parents, your support in ensuring your children meet and exceed our daily high expectations was crucial in bringing about the change that has made the UTC such a strong provision, thank you.

With the first week only being 3 school days, one of which was a Wednesday, it has taken a little longer than usual for children to settle into the routines, but we are getting there! We have had a big push on our expectations. Before Christmas the fatigue of the long term, meant some of expectations were becoming ragged. With this in mind, I would like to remind you and your child that:

- We have silent corridors at the UTC we have some double lessons and no bells, so when students move from one lesson to another, coupled with the size and design of the building, if they talked this would disturb the learning of others students will be staged if they repeatedly forget this.
- Uniform is not negotiable the letter sent to parents in July outlined uniform, make up and jewellery expectations, this can be found on the website.
- Homework will be set weekly in every subject as a minimum if a child fails to do homework this will be a stage 2 and an extension to the deadline will be given to complete. If the work is not completed by the extended timeframe, this becomes a stage 3. X3 stage 3 in a week will create an SLT detention after school on Friday from 4pm-5pm. Failure to attend this will result in Isolation which runs until 5pm. If a child is unlikely to be able to complete work to a deadline, it is better for them to see the staff member and explain, than wait for a lesson. College is always open until 6pm every day should a child want help with any task or to use the facilities. Homework set can be viewed on MCAS.

We once again have seen a worrying trend of students mimicking or idolising Andrew Tate. As more information and allegations come to light surrounding misogynist actions, rape and people trafficking linked to Andrew Tate, we will not support any action in college that suggests an allegiance to this. Please have discussions with your children, if they say they think we are being unreasonable about this.

In these meetings we will discuss, the recent report, preparation for Mocks (resources will be shared), attendance and Work Experience. With only 4 more weeks to half-term, we will be pushing everyone really hard and raising the bar, thank you in advance for your support, as always.
