They did it! Our Professional class F1 team have won the Nationals, not just English winners, but the whole of the UK. The six-strong Unity Racing team

beat 60 others to become F1 in Schools' national champions after a two-day event at Magna Science Adventure Centre in Rotherham.

They also returned to Scarborough as separate category winners for the best engineered and fastest car and best verbal presentation skills.

Team Principal and Design Engineer Jack Metcalfe (18) led Matiss Grieuska (16), Billy Fields (16), Ryan Gharib (17), Alistair Lamerton (15) and Will Boston (18) to victory. Jack says they have yet to come down to earth.

The world final will take place at the time of the Formula 1 Singapore Grand Prix in October. The team now has to fundraise to cover the trip's cost.

As well as winning the trip to Singapore in October, each member of the team will be offered a full fees bursary to read engineering at Aston University, an exclusive paddock tour at Silverstone, home of the British Grand Prix, and an F1 team factory tour. This is



worth thousands to each individual, truly deserved. Of course they couldn't have done this without Mr Shepherd and we all pass on our thanks to him for bringing this win in, well done all.

Continuing on a theme of success, we will hold our Year 11 Mock Assembly on Monday 31st, Period 3. At this assembly students will get their results from the trial three exams, plus individual revision lists for Maths and Science. The theme of the assembly is "If you change nothing, nothing changes", last year students used Easter to recuperate and then came back all rockets firing, ready to push hard to the end, if this year's students do the same we are heading for record results, it's all to play for.

BEYOND HOUSING JOBCLUB-THURSDAY 17TH APRIL



COMBINED CADET FORCE

Cadets have been working very hard over the past few months and we are now are at the stage where they have all completed their One Star Rank promotion to Junior Cadet. This has involved a number of lessons designed by the Royal Navy to give an introduction to the Royal Navy and to lay a foundation for skills that they will improve on over their time with CCF.

We are now moving forward towards Afloat Season and we are hoping on the first Friday in May to commence our sailing and watersports afloat training with the Sea Cadets at their training hub on the site of the Water Park at Wykeham.

We have a training partnership hub with the Sea Cadets where we utilise their instructors and staff to train our cadets to gain RYA (Royal Yacht Association) qualifications that are internationally recognised and are qualifications that last for life.

Our aim is to get as many of the cadets qualified with regards to Dinghy Level 1 and 2 over the training sessions. Our secondary objective is to get as many cadets as possible to participate in rowing on the lakes and hopefully other water sports as and when they are available. Subject to available training staff

On the back of this we are planning two weekend camps. These will again be with the Scarborough Sea Cadet Corps but a number of bunks/places have been set aside for CCF. It is vitally important that we support this initiative so at this time I am just looking for numbers to see if it is a possible trip to support.

The first weekend will be Friday 6th June 2025 through to Sunday 8th June 2025. The second weekend will be Friday 19th September through to Sunday 21st September 2025. Costs will be £15 for food for the weekend.

Accommodation will be at Driffield Cadet Camp and afloat training will be at Wykeham Lakes.

I would like to take 15 cadets. We will have land based activities on one of these days and the other three days will be afloat training - ie, Dinghy Sailing. The September Weekend will be a culmination of all the training provided and will involve a small assessment of the skills learned.

CARPARKING AND DROP OFF

LUNCH ACCOUNTS

Please remember that lunch accounts should be pre-loaded to account for meals students will need, rather than accounts going into a minus and then being paid off. A reminder to parents of those students in year 11, that we will no longer be able to accommodate an overdraft facility after the Easter break, so if your child does not have credit on their account they will be refused service.

SAFEGUARDING

It is essential for safeguarding purposes that Lanyards and identity cards are worn at all times. Should cards become lost or damaged these must be replaced. Replacements can be purchased via parent pay. Lanyards re required for identification for all working staff within the building. All students who have poor punctuality and fail to bring a lanyard receive immediate negative stages – these cumulatively result in Lunch time detentions.

MONITOR, REPORT ENCOURAGE

All students have been issued with emails and online accounts and all are reminded of the importance of maintaining security using college account usernames and passwords and to report concerns if they feel that accounts have been compromised.

ATTENDANCE

It is very important to ensure that all medical and illness absences are reported daily by parents using our absence line or enquiries to Miss. Brown our Data and Attendance Officer. Should you make a call for a reported student illness – please expect a phone call back from the attendance team to check details and provide support as required.

Absences for medical reasons will only be authorised if evidence is provided, and it remains the responsibility of parents to provide this evidence. Acceptable evidence includes appointment letters or texts, and photographs of prescriptions or medications showing the name & date. These can be emailed to the enquiries email address or handed in/ shown at Reception.


Attendance will always be a continual reminder. Excellent attendance is above 96.5%. It is important that all students work hard to continually improve, this contributes significantly to maintain and improve overall progress and attainment.

All students with 100% receive 10 professional points per week. Student above the 96.5 target receive 5 points per week.

Attendance monitoring and formal procedures are followed robustly. We work closely with NYC attendance team to address attendance concerns at the earliest stage.

Attendance Focus

Student support to achieve excellent attendance is vital. In addition to support from our attendance team. Students will receive regular attendance support sessions in college and actions on home -visits will be scaled up.
